SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Today, we hear again this mysterious gospel of the Transfiguration of Christ. This momentary vision of Christ, in His glory, was given in order to strengthen the three principal Apostles to face the trials of their faith, which the sufferings and crucifixion of their beloved Friend would bring on them. For the very same reason it is retold to us today, in the early part of Lent, to encourage us to persevere in our Lenten journey. It reminds us that, very soon, the Easter will be here and the message of joy once more. If we are sharers with Christ in His sufferings, we will share with him in His glory.

This is a truth we all too easily forget that we cannot, and do not, get to heaven in a limousine. Our time on earth is the chance given us by our heavenly Father to earn our eternal reward. This reward surpasses even the wildest imagination of people. We could never earn it, but God accepts the little we can do and provides the rest through His infinite mercy. And yet there are many, far too many, who refuse even that little bit that is asked of them, and are therefore running the risk of not being a part of God's plan for their eternal happiness.

Illness, trouble and disappointment are part of every person's life. These things respect neither wealth, nor power, nor position. The person who knows their purpose in life, and is always trying to reach the goal God's goodness has planned, can and will see in these trials of life the hand of a kind Father who is preparing us for greater things. Sufferings become understandable and more bearable because of our attitude to life and its meaning. People who ignore God and close their mind to the real events of life has nothing to uphold or console them in their hours of sorrow and pain. Yet, sorrow and pain will always be there, try as they will to avoid them, and they can see no value, no divine purpose in these misfortunes.

Christ has asked us to follow Him, carrying our daily cross, and, thankfully, at the end of our journey is not rock of Calvary, but resurrection, the entrance to a life of glory with our risen Savior. Our Lord never said life would be easy, or free of problems and strain! But He will guide us, if we let Him!

Let the thought of the **Transfiguration** encourage each one of us today, to do the little God demands of us, so that when we pass from this life, we may be assured of seeing Christ in His glory, ready to welcome us into His everlasting, glorious kingdom.
